

Introduction

This Modern Slavery Statement relates to actions and activities during the financial year 1st January – 31st December, 2025.

The statement sets out the Company's commitment to preventing slavery and human trafficking in our business activities, and the steps we have put in place with the aim of ensuring that there is no slavery or human trafficking in our own business and supply chains.

Structure and Supply Chains

This statement covers the business activities of the Company, which are as follows:

Importer and wholesaler of non-ferrous and ferrous semi-finished products and cables into the U.K. and Republic of Ireland.

The Company is of the Viohalco Group, a Belgium-based holding company of leading metal processing companies across Europe.

The Company operates predominantly in the UK. Our suppliers, which are all part of the Viohalco Group, are based in Europe and are not considered to be at risk of modern slavery or human trafficking.

Policies

The Company is committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our business, or our supply chains. This Statement affirms its intention to act ethically in our business relationships.


High Risk Areas
